

Roberts Foundation, the project resulted in a dramatic new look for the Roberts Terrace, as the newly named terrace and entry to the Vernon Center are now known in recognition of support for this project. LeWitt has also donated four maquettes, which were the

first thoughts for the project. They are now part of the College's art collection curated by the faculty in art history.

Recorded on video for use in introductory art history courses and courses on 20th-century art, the project will live on to help future undergraduates understand issues related to public art and site-specific art.
